

#### **America violates UN Charter**

Dear Friends for Peace,

The Canadian Peace Congress condemns the murders of Iranian General Soleimani and others in the motorcade leaving Baghdad International Airport on January 3rd, 2020 as an act of war by the United States against Iraq and Iran.

This American criminal action is an act of aggression, a violation of the UN Charter and every norm of international law. It places the entire world at risk of a generalised war.

The excuses offered by the United States government for this barbarity reflect their hypocrisy, their complete lack of morality, their contempt for law, their contempt for civilized behaviour.

We must remember that the US forces in Iraq are invading and occupying forces that destroyed Iraq in the years since their invasion of 2003. The invasion, undertaken under the false pretext that Iraq possessed weapons of mass destruction, began with the murders of thousands of people in the "shock and awe" campaign on the very first day, continued with their show trial and murder of President Hussein and continues to the present, along with their invasion and occupation of Afghanistan and their invasion and occupation of Syria. Millions have died as a result.

The untold suffering caused by the illegal US economic embargo on Iran, in violation of the UN Charter and the Rome Statute concerning collective punishment of civilian populations, is well known and is also an act of war.

This is not the first assassination of Iranian citizens by the United States. The Americans, with Israeli help, have carried out multiple assassinations of Iranian scientists and officials in the past and have repeatedly threatened to kill the country's leadership.

These are the actions of criminals. Therefore, we call on the International Criminal Court to condemn the American actions as a war crime even if it has no jurisdiction over them and we call on the Security Council to refer the matter to the ICC, thereby giving the ICC the jurisdiction it needs to file war crimes charges against Donald Trump and all the officials involved.

We also call on the Canadian government to withdraw all its forces in Iraq, which are in violation of the UN Charter and the National Defence Act.

#### NATO is a threat to the climate

Last week, the 29 leaders of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) went to celebrate their alliance's anniversary in London, but snubbed the opening of United Nations climate conference where the other 164 world leaders and their delegations are meeting in Madrid.

Despite several scientific reports urgently warning about the devastating impacts and security implications of rising carbon emissions, climate change was not even on the NATO agenda.

Instead, the *alliance leaders* discussed Russia and China as adversaries, space as a new warfighting domain, greater warfare readiness and more defence spending.

Yet the Euro-Atlantic alliance instigates conflict with its combat troops along Russia's borders and its containment measures against China. Space is a fragile global common that is already contaminated by debris and should be protected not weaponized.

It is NATO that is dangerously diverting our attention and resources to war and away from the grave threat of global warming.

NATO members spend approximately \$1 trillion annually on their militaries, which is more than 50% of global military spending. At the 2014 NATO Summit in Wales, members made a commitment to spend 2% of their GDP on defence by 2024 with 20% of that amount to be on equipment.

At this year's London summit, Canada was repeatedly *admonished* for not spending enough on defence.

However, the *latest NATO expenditure report* shows that Canada spent \$29 billion on the Department of National Defence, which is 1.31% of GDP. On a cash basis, *Canada* is now ranked 6<sup>th</sup> highest among NATO members and 14<sup>th</sup> highest in the world for military spending. (Continued page 3)

By contrast, according to the *Public Accounts of Canada*, the federal government spent only \$1.8 billion on the Department of Environment and Climate Change, which is 0.08% of GDP. Very little is allotted to the principal department tasked with protecting our natural environment.

Moreover, under the 2016 Pan-Canadian Framework for Clean Growth and Climate Change, \$132 billion of new spending over the next eleven years was announced by the federal and provincial governments. However, Canada's 2017 defence policy, Strong Secure Engaged, promised more than \$553 billion to maintain "high-end warfighting" to meet NATO's requirements.

To stay interoperable, NATO members have to constantly upgrade their military capabilities. This procurement primarily benefits the big US arms manufacturers, which is why President Trump pushes alliance members to spend more on defence.

Yet, fighter jets, attack helicopters, warships and armoured vehicles are *petroleum-powered* and notoriously energy-inefficient. Within NATO countries, it is the military that is the largest institutional consumer of oil and largest emitter of greenhouse gases.

Worse, in Canada like in other NATO members, the Canadian Armed Forces are exempted from reducing their emissions for their military vehicles and operations.

On the eve of the Madrid climate conference, the UN Secretary General Antonio Guterres said, "Our war against nature must stop." It is NATO that is perpetuating this war against nature by fuelling a carbon-intensive arms race and fomenting an expensive new Cold War.

Unsurprisingly, the recent *UN emissions gap* report explains that Canada and the other NATO countries are not on track to limit the global mean temperature rise to 1.5°C. This past decade while NATO has fought its deadly and destructive global war on terror, the planet has warmed to the hottest on record.

Shamefully, NATO countries have also failed to meet their climate financing commitments. These wealthy, polluting countries have not adequately invested in the UN Green Climate Fund and have only pledged a paltry \$7.5 billion over the next four years to help poor, developing countries adapt to climate-induced droughts, fires and flooding.

Outside the NATO Summit, thousands of people from across the United Kingdom and Europe converged to call for the dissolution of the military alliance and for greater climate action. In Canada, we demonstrated in solidarity against the NATO Association of Canada, an institution funded by the US weapons giants Lockheed Martin and General Dynamics, in Toronto.

As revealed by a recent *YouGov* poll, support for NATO is waning in key members' states: the UK, France and Germany. People are starting to see the military alliance as an aggressive, unaffordable anachronism that is polluting the climate and impeding progress on the Paris Agreement.

A rapid reduction of greenhouse gases and a robust green new deal are not possible with rising military emissions and expenditures. We must work peacefully and cooperatively through the UN system with Russia, China and the entire international community on solving our common security challenge – averting catastrophic climate change.

# UK banks and insurers to be tested on climate crisis response plans

Bank of England to force firms to say how they would respond to temperature rise of up to  $4\mathrm{C}$ 

By: Kalyeena Makortoff From: The Guardian, Dec. 18, 2019 UK banks and insurers will be forced to reveal how exposed they are to the climate crisis and how they would respond to the effects of a temperature rise of up to 4C under the Bank of England's first climate stress tests.

The Bank has <u>put forward proposals</u> to test the performance and health of the UK financial system for a range of climate-linked financial risks, including the failure of governments and consumers to take action.

The tests are expected to uncover the extent of the financial sector's exposure to climate risks, and gauge company responses that could cause spillover effects for the global economy.

However, the Bank will not identify individual businesses through the tests and will release only aggregate results for the banking and insurance sectors.

Threadneedle Street has, however, not ruled out releasing individual results in the future, and plans to use the initial reports to inform how it supervises each company.

The tests, to be released for the first time in 2021, will cover the same UK banks subject to *financial stress testing*, including HSBC, Barclays, Standard Chartered, Royal Bank of Scotland, Santander UK, Lloyds and Nationwide. By 2021, CYBG – rebranded as Virgin Money – will also be included. About 39 insurers are expected be tested on their climate resilience.

The testing will cover three scenarios, including "early policy action", where the transition to a carbon-neutral economy is clear and decisive, resulting in the global temperature rise staying below 2C, in line with the 2015 <u>Paris climate</u> agreement.

In a second "late policy action scenario", global climate targets will also be met, but the transition will have been delayed by 10 years, leading to more drastic and immediate action that could cause an economic shock.

In the final scenario, governments fail to introduce policies to address the climate emergency, and companies and consumers do not change their behaviour. Global temperatures increase "substantially" – by about 4C – by 2080, resulting in rising sea levels and more frequent, extreme weather events such as flash floods.

Drastic environmental changes around the world would damage property, infrastructure and farmland, disrupt business supply chains, and lead to mass migration and deaths, the Bank said.

"This reduces asset values, results in lower profitability for companies, damages public finances and increases the cost of settling underwriting losses for insurers," it said. Spillover effects such as lower output and productivity would compound those problems.

The environmental risks of climate change are already affecting financial companies in the UK, with about 10% of domestic mortgages exposed to properties in flood-risk zones. Some British banks are also exposed to regions extremely vulnerable to climate change, such as south-east Asia. Countries along the equator are expected to be uninhabitable for much of the year due to high humidity under a 4C-rise scenario.

If temperatures increase *to that level*, rising ocean acidity would wipe out coral reefs, shellfish and plankton, starving the oceans of oxygen and leading to a decline in sea life, environmental experts have warned. Saharan deserts are expected to expand into southern and central Europe, while the vast majority of the global population would have to migrate to northern regions, where farming would be viable.

According to a study by Solomon Hsiang and Edward Miguel of University of California, Berkeley, and Marshall Burke of Stanford University, unmitigated global warming would lead to a 23% loss in per capita earning globally by the end of the century.

The Bank's proposals will go out for consultation until March and it is requesting feedback from financial companies, climate scientists, economists and other industry experts.

The Bank's governor, Mark Carney, said the tests were a "pioneering exercise, which builds on the considerable progress in addressing climate-related risks that has already been made by firms, central banks and regulators. *Climate change* will affect the value of virtually every financial asset."

He added that the tests would "help ensure the core of our financial system is resilient to those changes".

Carney is taking on the role of <u>UN special envoy</u> for climate action and finance after he steps down from the Bank next month. His main focus will be on mobilising private finance to invest in schemes that will help achieve the Paris goal of limiting *global temperature rises to* 1.5C.
